> ATTENTION - FOR ALL OIL PAINTING STUDENTS: In order to maintain healthy, safe, and environmentally conscious studios the following materials ARE NOT PERMITTED in the $92 Y$ Art Center: Lavender Oil; Odorless Mineral Spirits; Turpentine; Liquin, Neo-Meglip, Galkyd, or any other petroleum based medium; varnish or retouch varnish; any other solvent beside Gamsol.

Oil Paints -Purchase small tubes except unless noted. Buy artist-grade paint if possible, not Winton, Blick or Utrech brands. Artist-grade brands are: Winsor-Newton, Gamblin, Holbein, Grumbacher, Old Holland, Sennelier, Williamsburg. Please avoid colors called "tint" or "hue".

- Terhune: alizarin crimson, Napthol red, ultramarine blue, Cerulean Blue (Hue ok), Hansa yellow medium, Hansa yellow light (lemon), Indian yellow, Burnt sienna, Burnt umber
- Staiger: Ivory Black, Cadmium Yellow Pale, Cadmium Red Medium, titanium white (big tube), ultramarine blue, alizarin crimson, Cadmium Orange, Cobalt Violet, Permanent Green
- Vanderhyden: alizarin crimson, ultramarine blue, raw sienna, burnt sienna, cadmium red medium, raw umber, sap green, cadmium yellow medium, cerulean blue, cadmium lemon yellow, titanium white (big tube), pthalo green
- Seeger: Cadmium Red Medium, Titanium White (big tube), Cobalt blue, Alizarin Crimson, Cadmium Lemon Yellow, Cobalt Violet, Permanent Green, Ultramarine Blue, Cadmium Yellow Medium

Brushes - Bore bristle brushes are best for oil paint. Nylon/synthetic brushes are too soft. Do not purchase brushes designated for acrylic paint.

- Terhune: Rounds: \#2, \#8, \#12; Filberts: \#6; Flats: \#10
- Staiger: \#12 flat/ any other brushes you desire in this shape, \#6 filbert/any other brushes you desire in this shape, \# 2, \#8, \#12 rounds, 2.5 or 3 inch chip brush or gesso brush
- Vanderhyden: Select a range of sizes, small and large (from \#2 to \#10) for: Flats, Rounds \& Filberts. A combination of bristle and synthetic brushes is recommended, but students should feel free to buy one or the other, as their tastes see fit.
- Seeger: Select a range of sizes, small and large (from \#2 to \#10) for: Flats, Rounds \& Filberts. A combination of bristle and synthetic brushes is recommended, but students should feel free to buy one or the other, as their tastes see fit. * same as Vanderhyden

Palette Knives - Metal palette knife - trowel-like shape, approximately the length of your thumb or longer (i.e. not small ones)


## Canvas(es)

- Terhune: Canvas panels - three pack of $10 \times 20$ (approx.); Canvas panels - three pack of $16 \times 20$
- Staiger: 2 Small canvases or canvas boards: $12 \times 16$ inches, One Large canvas $16 \times 20$ inches, One square or round canvas $12 \times 12$ inches or 12 inch diameter
- Vanderhyden: Two or three canvas boards or pre-stretched canvases ( 16 " x 20 "and/or 18 " x 24 ") One canvas pad ( 16 " x 20 "); One drawing board larger than 16 " $\times 20$ " to support for canvas pad sheets (optional: drawing boards are available in studios)
- Seeger: $2-3$ pre-stretched canvas $16^{\prime \prime} \times 20$ " ( 2 if desired), $18^{\prime \prime} \times 24$

Palette - One disposable paper palette pad (11" x 16 ")

## Miscellaneous

Two metal palette knives
Small jar cold-pressed linseed oil
Drawing pencil and eraser

Roll masking tape
Latex gloves (box) Paper towels (Bounty) Cotton rags

Two small glass or metal jars with lids to hold liquid Bar of Ivory soap or soap for cleaning brushes

Oil Paints: One large tube of titanium white and One small tube of Mars or lvory black Medium: Cold-pressed linseed oil - small or medium-sized jar Clean-Up: Silcoil jar with coil (glass jar with coil inside and lid); Small jug of Turpenoid Natural (cleaner)

## Additional for Melissa Staiger's Class:

One small tube of acrylic paint of your choice, One small container of gesso, One small jar of matte medium, black sharpie, fine tip or medium, pencil \#2 or B, paper palette large size, coil jar for brushes, gloves in a bottle or a barrier cream or lotion for your hands
