Beginner Jewelry

Learn the basics to get you starting to making jewelry.

March Session: Learn to use a jewelers saw frame, basic soldering, hammer textures stamping and finishing. Projects will include choice of cuff, earrings or pendant and stacking rings and bangles with textures

Supply List:

- 3x6 20g copper or brass sheet
- 2x3 20g sterling silver sheet
- 12" 16g round wire
- 12" 14g 1/2 round wire
- 12" 14g square wire

April Session: Learn stone setting -bezel and tube. Settings for round faceted stones and round or oval cabochon.

Supply List:

- 2x3 20g sheet
- Tube will depend on size of facet stones
- Tubing heavy wall 3.57 (can purchase from teacher or rio grande)
- Tubing heavy wall 4.57 (can purchase from teacher or rio grande)
- 3mm or 4mm round facet stone
- Round or Oval Cabochon no smaller than 8mm
- Think about your designs and if there are any other materials you would like to incorporate. This can be discussed on the first day.

Student Guidelines & Studio Rules

Studios are open 15 min before the start of class.

Do not enter any studio without your instructor present.

Do not enter a studio until the previous class has ended and all the participants have left the room and your instructor is present.

Students must leave studios after their class is over.

Do not use any tool that you are unfamiliar with as it could permanently damage the tool particularly hammers.

Only use hammers that you are familiar with like a “hardware hammer” if it doesn’t look familiar don’t use it you will ruin it.

Exhaust fans must be turned on when torches are being used or any materials is being melted.

Tools & Torches are coded with six different colors which denote the studios they belong in and their use;

Blue S353

Yellow S355

Red S352

Orange S350
